## How to help your child THRIVE in AWANA

Parents and Guardians are essential helpers in the enjoyment of Awana. Please consider the following tips in order to allow your child to get the most from his/her Club:

- Help your child to attend Awana every week.
- Make sure they wear their uniform and bring their handbooks each week.
- Be sure they arrive on time: 6:15-6:30 p.m. Promptness helps maintain good discipline.
- Attend all major events. Parents and guardians are always welcome to attend any club meeting.
- Pick up your child promptly at 8:00 p.m. All clubbers need to be picked up from their classroom by a parent/quardian.
- Always encourage your child. Children have more fun when their parents or guardians show interest in their accomplishments.
- Set aside a few minutes at bedtime, after dinner or Sunday afternoons to review your child's verses with them. Bible memorization is a great way to help children make good decisions later in life.

T&T is the Awana program for kids in 3rd - 5th/6th grades. Truth and Training's curriculum teaches third to sixth graders the TRUTH of who God is and TRAINS them to share this truth as they follow Him. T&T focuses on the basics of the Christian faith and guides kids to a deeper understanding of God's grace. Each year of T&T contains lessons about God (Unit 1), the Bible (Unit 2), Jesus (Unit 3), Life Application (Unit 4), and corresponding memory verses.

Each week clubbers will use their book to guide them through activities to think about the Bible and apply it to everyday experiences. They will dive deeper into Scripture by looking up passages, memorizing verses, and seeing biblical truths repeated throughout Scripture. They will spend their small group time in discussion about their counsel time lesson and having a time of prayer together.

By saying memorization verses your clubber will earn T&T Awana bucks which can be used in the T&T store throughout the year. Your child can earn extra bucks by completing the "Small Group" section of their handbook at home each week as a part of their quiet time. They can also earn extra Camp Scholarship money and Awana bucks by completing the Silver and Gold sections of their handbook.

To ensure that your T&T member benefits from the evening club's activities could you please:

- Study with them between meetings, memorizing with your child is such an encouragement to them!
- Encourage your clubber to complete the Explore section of Bible Study for each section. This will help them learn more about their memory verse and work toward a camp scholarship.
- Have your clubber wear their T&T jersey to club each week and have fun with the dress-up themes.

- Be on time to drop them off and pick them up each week.

**Awana Grand Prix:** During the month of February, T&T Clubbers will be making an Awana Grand Prix race car. The Grand Prix is where our clubbers design a race car out of a block of wood. We then have a race night where the kids race the cars they have made against each other. There are trophies given out to the three fastest cars and the three cars voted best in design. More information on the AWANA Grand Prix will be available as we get closer to winter.

Parents, if you would like to take part in helping your child build their Grand Prix race car, you are welcome to join us or work with your child outside of Awana. If you intend to work Grand Prix cars outside of Awana nights please contact Sarah Bayley or Cheyenne Smith in January so we can give you the car kit. Please remember that if you take the car kit home, you are responsible for that kit! Every child will be given one car kit for free. If the parts come up missing or if it is lost, you will be charged for a second kit. Car kits are \$5.00 each.

Our Awana Grand Prix Race Night will be held on Wednesday, February 28th at 6:30p.m. in the church gymnasium. Family and friends are encouraged to come and cheer on their child!

**Weather Updates:** In case of bad weather, the church staff along with the commander will determine whether to cancel club. Listen to WoodTV 8 OR watch the First Baptist Church Facebook page for cancellation information.

**Discipline Policy:** Group Discipline The 1-5 Count system is used for group discipline. The leader counts from 1-5 with the expectation that the clubbers will be silent by the time leader gets to "5". If spoken with authority (with some grace) and enforced, this process is quite effective. If a group does not comply then the whole group must sit silently for a minute or two before moving on to the next activity. If it continues to be a problem, we remind them we will have to miss some game time.

Individual Discipline - 3 warning system

All leaders/directors and commander need to be in constant communication to be able to identify situations when individuals have "been warned".

Warning 1 - when a child does not comply with the adult or misbehaves in some way, the adult gently reminds the child of the rules and explains the infraction, and gives the first warning.

Warning 2 - If the child continues to disrupt (that same night) child and leader will talk to the commander (if available) or director. The commander or director will take the child aside and be very specific with the child (discuss rules, infractions, possible reasons for misbehavior, and eventual consequences.) Depending on the severity of the behavior and availability of personnel director or commander may have the child sit out of game time that evening.

Warning 3 - If a child continues to misbehave, the child will be warned a third time and a meeting with parents must be called. (If this can be handled at pick-up that is great.) Parents will be told of all behaviors leading up to the meeting and a review of the behavior policy will take place. \*Depending on the severity of the infraction the child may be asked not to return for one week of club.

After a child has been through all three of these warnings and comes back to club, he or she will get a clean slate. However, if the clubber returns and the behavior continues, they will have the three warnings described above. If after the second time of speaking with the parents the child's misbehavior continues, the commander and director will meet with the parents to determine what is the best course of action.

\*The FBC Awana program reserves the right to suspend the attendance of a child after one meeting with the parent if the misbehavior arises to a point that endangers or threatens the safety of other clubbers or leaders.
